Choosing a Confirmation Name/Info Sheet

There is an intrinsic relationship between the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. If the Candidate's Baptismal name is a saint's name, the Candidate should become familiar with the life and witness of this saint. If not, the Candidate should choose a saint's name and also become familiar with the life and witness of this saint.

How do I go about choosing a name?

You are not arbitrarily choosing a name, or selecting one because you like the way it sounds, but you are essentially asking that saint to be a lifetime friend, or "patron." Patrons help us live as Christians both through their prayers for us (intercession) and their good example (witness). (cf. CCC 2156, 956) The steps below will guide you through this process.

I. Learn about the saints.

You may not know about too many saints, but that's okay - take this time to learn about them! You might start your reading with a saint that has similar interests. Sometimes, patrons are chosen because of the day on which their feast falls. For example, if your birthday is on September 4th, you might choose St. Rose of Viterbo. Sometimes, patrons might be chosen because of family ties, e.g. you have a close relationship with your grandfather, whose name is "Mark," so you choose St. Mark. If your baptismal name is a saint's name, then start there. You may also want to take our parish patron's name, Francis. There are many different places to begin your research, but your patron should be someone you want to imitate in their love for Christ and others.

2. Choose your patron saint and Confirmation name.
